



Feels like spring at the Fondazione Braglia

The Fondazione Gabriele e Anna Braglia in Lugano welcomes 2017 by reopening the exhibit dedicated to the Slovenia-Italian artist **Zoran Music** (1909-2005) and remaining open until the 1st of July.



Zoran Music, *Nous ne sommes pas les derniers*, 1974.


The exhibit counts 68 works by the artist. Oils, drawings, watercolours, dry points and graphics made between 1946 and 1992 which introduce the visitor to the main topics of Music's work. Attention is therefore dedicated to the lively Venetian watercolours made in the Forties, to the *Dalmatian motifs* and *Colts* which recall the artist's childhood and the very important series of *Nous ne sommes pas les derniers* (*We are not the last*) made in the Seventies in which Music expresses his dramatic experience in the concentration camp of Dachau. The portraits, the self-portraits and as an appendix a section dedicated to the landscapes and the floral motifs follow.

Exceptional opening during OpenGallery #13

The Foundation's Collection grows

Two new acquisitions enlarge the part of the collection dedicated to German Expressionism: *Mother with Son* (s.d.) and *Munch in the Garden of the Cloister* (1925), both made by Marianne von Werefkin, an important female figure in the art scene at the beginning of the 20th century. The collection also received a significant donation: the bronze sculpture entitled *Caballero* made in 2011 by the Spanish master Manolo Valdés (n. 1942), one of the better-known contemporary artists.
